



VISION STATEMENT

Provide an artistic facility in a rural park-like setting for the teaching and exploration of 'big' art, performance art and land stewardship.

Facility Features

- Approximately 50 acres of land, ideally consisting of a mix of forest land and open space, located in rural King County near the I-90 corridor west of Snoqualmie
- Open-air structures to support the teaching of glass blowing, metal forging & welding, pottery, stone sculpture, and other 'big' art
- Semi-enclosed structure to house performance arts such as theater, dance and music
- Trails and other forest facilities to allow land stewardship and conservation education
- Open area connecting the various artistic venues to encourage strolling between venues
- Kitchen / café / concessions to allow sales of food for performances and facilities rentals

Environmental Enhancements

- All facilities would 'relate' to the outdoors, allowing artists to be creative within a natural environment
- All structures would employ 'green' building techniques and utilize alternative energy when practical
- Wastewater/sewage would be handled using state-of-the-art technology; gray water would be treated and utilized for irrigation

Programs & Activities

- Visiting artists
- Art, environment, theater, dance classes for all ages
- Forest stewardship activities
- Indoor and outdoor performance arts
- Community resource / meeting area

Revenue Sources – Sustainable Self-Funding

- Ticket sales for artistic performances
- Enrollment fees for classes and educational seminars
- Rental fees for use of facilities
- Retail sales of art and food
- Capital fund-raising campaigns
- Grants for arts and stewardship
